Meghan's Musing

Extraordinary Time

Advent has come and gone. Christmas Day is in the history books. Many trees have been taken down and, by the time you read this, New Year's Day might have even passed. With all the excitement and activity of the holidays behind us, it can be easy to dismiss the liturgical season of "Ordinary Time" as "Boring Time," especially with the worst of winter yet to come and warmer longer days not even on the horizon.

I wonder how we might transform this little window of time between Christmas and Lent from boring "Ordinary Time" into Extraordinary Time?

The January 1 entry in theologian Frederick Buechner's book of daily meditations, *Listening to Your Life*, nudges us to see the extraordinary in the ordinary:

I discovered that if you really keep your eye peeled to it and your ears open, if you really pay attention to it, even such a limited and limiting life as the one I was living on Rupert Mountain opened up onto extraordinary vistas. Taking your children to school and kissing your wife goodbye. Eating lunch with a friend. Trying to do a decent day's work. Hearing the rain patter against the window. There is no event so commonplace but that God is present within it, always hiddenly, always leaving you room to recognize him or not to recognize him, but all the more fascinatingly because of that, all the more compellingly and hauntingly.... If I were called upon to state in a few words the essence of everything I was trying to say both as a novelist and as a preacher, it would be something like this: Listen to your life. See it for the fathomless mystery that it is. In the boredom and pain of it no less than in the excitement and gladness: touch, taste, smell your way to the holy and hidden heart of it because in the last analysis all moments are key moments, and life itself is grace.

My prayer for each one of us in the year 2020 is that we would all listen to our lives, realize that "all moments are key moments" and find the extraordinary in the ordinary. Amen.


veggies and a variety of goodies. (See pictures below).

The Mission Committee met Dec. 2. We celebrated the collection of \$1030 for the Harvest Offering last month. We also took advantage of a one-day 2 for 1 matching grant to provide \$450 for the building of two new wells in Africa through the Marion Medical Mission, whose representative spoke at our church several weeks ago. We responded to a plea from the Friends from lowa Foundation in Polk County for \$300 to construct a new roof on the church building in Munoces, El Salvador. That community was in relationship with our church for several years, and our feelings for them continue; this was a great opportunity to help.

We continue to support Neighbors Helping Neighbors through laundry nights and the Salvation Army food pantry through donations and funds. During this Advent season we organized bell-ringers for the Salvation Army red kettle campaign, and gift-giving to Progress Industries clients and to the Salvation Army Angel Tree. The Christmas Joy offering will be received Dec. 22.

Plans to assist recipients of the food programs at Salvation Army continue to evolve. The goal is to help promote better use of food items received – items that may be unfamiliar to some people and that may offer more healthy nutritional options.
